

Syringe Litter Reporting and Reduction efforts

Improvements on My Santacruz County App Prior to launch

Continuing to work with partners to establish proper routing of reports of syringe litter

HIV/HCV testing

- We have offered HIV/HCV Testing through our Emeline Exchange on Fridays in the month of November
- We are developing a plan to incentivize testing using gift cards

Participant Surveys

- We asking participants to complete a quick survey to collect information on Syringe usage:
- 1) Approximately how many times a day do you inject drugs?
- 2) Approximately how many times do you use a syringe before switching to a new Sterile syringe?
- 3) Do you ever share syringes with others (use the same syringe)? (Y/N)

If yes: Approximately how many times have you shared a syringe in the last 3 months?
