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

2005 BIRTH CERTIFICATE SUMMARY & HIGHLIGHTS

This year 2005 Birth Certificate Summary Report of 3,899 births includes all births to Santa Cruz County residents (3,379) and an additional 520 births to women who live in other counties, but delivered in Santa Cruz County. Of the 3,379 county residents' births, 186 delivered outside of the county and the indicator data concerning their births is shown in the "Out-of-County" column in Table I. The 520 non-county residents' birth data included in this report are interspersed among the three delivery facilities in the county, with Watsonville Community Hospital delivering the greater majority (383) of non-Santa Cruz County residents. 411 of the out-of-county residents live in Monterey County, with 167 of these births to Monterey County residents living in zip code 95076 (Watsonville/Pajaro area).


KEY HEALTH INDICATORS

BIRTHS TO TEENS decreased by 34 this year, and the birth rate decreased slightly from 32 to 31 per 1,000 teen female population. This rate remains well below California's rate of 38/1,000 (yr 2004 data). Among the 344 teen births, 77% were to south county residents in Watsonville/Freedom and 90% were to Hispanic teens countywide. Seventeen percent (17%) of teen births had their second birth or more, a rate that remains lower than both the state (19%, 2003 data) and USA (21%, 2004 data). In comparison to the total birthing population, teens had higher rates of inadequate care, late or no prenatal care and pre-term births, but a slightly lower rate of low birth weight, as shown below.




KEY HEALTH INDICATORS, continued

MEDI-CAL BIRTHS increased by 1% to 50% of total births in the county this year compared to 2004. Watsonville Community Hospital continues to have the highest number of its births funded through Medi-Cal (77%) and continues to deliver the majority of the county's Medi-Cal funded births (68%). Of the 520 births to out of county residents, 72% were funded by Medi-Cal. The graph below highlights key health indicators for Medi-Cal vs. private insurance births.



KEY INDICATORS BY ETHNICITY are shown below. Hispanic mothers accounted for 59% of births vs. 39% White. Percent of low birth weight for White and Hispanic mothers were the same (5.4%). Overall low birth weight rate did not change notably (5.1% in 2004 compared to 5.6% in 2005), and remains below California at 6.7% (2004, latest available). Pre-term births were slightly higher among Hispanics (9.5% vs. 8.9% for Whites), but still below the CA at 10.7% and USA at 12.3% (2003 – latest available). Hispanic mothers had a notably higher rate of less-than-adequate prenatal care, based on the Kotelchuk Index. Other ethnicities/races are not included in the chart below, because their combined percent was less than 5% of total birthing population; ethnicity was not available for 66 (2%) of birth mothers.
